4X4 Certificate Program Overview

“University for Creative Korea-II” is a government effort to financially and technically support university education nationwide. University departments from across the country compete to be selected for the CK-II program. The joint team of the department of international studies and the department of political science and international relations was selected for CK-II support under its internationalization category in 2014.

With the CK-II support, both departments at Kyung Hee university are developing and enacting various programs that contribute to human society through the training of comprehensive, talented individuals engaged in academics and actions.

These programs include the Four(categories)-by-Four(capacities) Certificate Program, various overseas educational opportunities, exchange student/dual bachelor’s degree programs, domestic and international internships, social service programs, student activities and so on. Of these programs, the Four-by-Four Certificate Program allows for the combined presentation of all related programs.

"Four-by-Four Certificate Program" is a Four-category (global civil society, global inequalities, global cooperation, global business) certificate course to foster the Four capacities (Foundation in the Humanities, Creative thinking with convergence, Practical Business Skills through Hands-on Experiences, Social Responsibility).

Participation of this program provides extra points for applying various overseas educational opportunities, exchange student/dual bachelor’s degree programs, domestic and international internships, social service programs which are being supported by CK-II. In addition, priority consideration will be given to TA/RA selection.

Four Categories which applicants should select

- Enrolled students in both departments can choose one or two specific categories.

Four Capacities which applicants must be qualified

Capacity 1: Foundation in the Humanities

1) Overview

‘1st Capacity: Foundation in the Humanities’ aims to develop the personality and talent as a global citizen by liberal arts courses in Humanitas College.

2) Qualification

- Applicants should take at least two courses in Social science, Peace, and History subjects of the liberal arts of Humanitas College.

Capacity 2: Creative thinking with Convergence

1) Overview

‘2nd capacity: Creative thinking with convergence’ aims to develop creative thinking and

adaptability based on inter-disciplinary expertise with major courses as well as “Problem Solving Courses.”

Especially, Problem Solving Courses are the courses for self-directed learning to find the ways to solve many domestic and international problems. Independent Study, Action Learning Project and any other courses are designated by the Problem Solving Courses.

2) Qualification

Applicants should complete three things as follows.

- More than 3 designated courses for each type of major
- More than 1 Problem Solving Course in consultation with advisor
- Achieve above 'B0' grades in all above courses.

‘3rd capacity: Practical Business Skills through Hands-on Experiences’ aims to develop the confrontation ability and problem solving capacity through internship and study-abroad program.

2) Qualification

Applicants should complete more than 1 of the following list.

- Long/short term internship (more than 80 hours)
 - Study-abroad program (more than 1 credit)
 - Job seeking program held by department/college/university (more than 20 hours)
- ※ Global Campus program is considered as study-abroad program.

Capacity 4: Social Responsibility

1) Overview

‘4th capacity: Social Responsibility’ aims to develop social and global responsibility, with respect to co-prosperity and peace, through domestic and foreign social contribution project and volunteer work.

2) Qualification

- Applicants should engaged in social contribution project for more than 64 hours.

3) Example

- Volunteer works at Global Service Corps of Kyung Hee University(GSC), Volunteer KIC, and Kyung Hee Happy House
- Volunteer works at KHU-UNESCO International Workcamp, KOICA, Amnesty International activities and foreign ODA volunteer works
- Volunteer works at firms, local volunteer programs at global corporation
