College of International Studies

The College of International Studies, or KIC (Kyung Hee International College), produces well-rounded graduates with focused specializations in international relations, economics or international business who can play the leading role in this era of globalization. Our graduates are known for their broad perspectives and their remarkable skills sets. They have gone on to work for major international organizations, multinational corporations, the international media, NGOs, and public sector agencies.

The curriculum at KIC is both inter-disciplinary and trans-disciplinary, challenging students to develop expertise in international relations, international economics, global business, or East Asian studies while maintaining a broad understanding of all disciplines and the interplay between them. The KIC curriculum is entirely in English and demands the highest skills in writing and speaking. KIC offers a joint Bachelor’s and Master’s degree program together with the Graduate School of Pan-Pacific International Studies, or GSP. The joint program permits students to earn both degrees in 5 years. Our graduates find the variety of courses, internships and extra-curricular programs of KIC immensely rewarding in their careers.

The newly launched KIC graduate programs are an extension of the undergraduate programs in KIC. The KIC graduate programs are accredited degree programs offering MA. and Ph.D. degrees in the field of international studies. Compared to the GSP programs, KIC graduate programs are more academically oriented, underscoring research and thesis writings. Same KIC and GSP faculty members provide graduate-level, inter- and trans-disciplinary all-English courses. Students will also be able to have opportunities to conduct collaborative research projects with them, as well as with a number of international prominent scholars invited by the Kyung Hee University every year.

Curriculum



Graduate programs in the College of International Studies offer interdisciplinary courses. The curriculum encompasses major disciplines in the field of international studies including international relations, international economics, global business, international law, and East Asian studies. All students are required to acquire credit units and write thesis (dissertation in Ph.D. program) in English.



- **Departmental Scholarship**: College of International Studies provides a limited number of scholarship opportunities to KIC graduate students

- Combined Bachelor's and Master's Degree Program: Pre-approved KIC undergraduates can continue to Master's program to complete combined degree in 5 years (3.5 years of undergraduate and 1.5 years of graduate periods)
- Enrollment fee and the half of the first semester's graduate tuition is waived
- Further exemption is available at semester basis

- Application submission: October 1 to October 31 (by 5 PM)
- Notification of admission: December 5 (<http://ghkh.khu.ac.kr>)
- Registration with tuition payment: January 2 to January 9, 2015 (by 4 PM)



- Eligibility

- Master's Program: The applicant must have a Bachelor's degree or in the final semester of Bachelor's degree program at the time of application
- Ph.D. Program: The applicant must have a Master's degree or in the final semester of Master's degree at the time of application

- Required Documents

- Application form cover (Signed with a passport-sized photo)
- Application for admission (Attach a passport-sized photo)
- Official certificate of graduate
- Official transcripts
- Personal statement
- Research plan
- Two letters of recommendation (One from your advisor)
- Declaration of ethical conduct in research
- A copy of passport
- Signed consent form
- Information collection and use agreement
- Application form for President Scholarship (only those who apply)
- Application fee: KRW 100,000 (Pay on-site or enclose with other application documents if you mail-in your application)

- Only one application per department is allowed
- The Graduate School of Kyung Hee University is not responsible for any disadvantages incurred by typing errors and/or missing documents
- All documents must be originals accompanied by translations and notarization in Korean or English (if originals are not written in Korean or English)
- All official documents' date of issue must be within 3 months
- Submitted documents and application fee will not be refunded under any circumstances
- Applicants who have not graduated at the time of application must submit a certificate of graduate before entrance into KIC graduate programs. Otherwise admission will be cancelled
- International students must carry medical insurance upon admittance until the end of graduation on your own expenses. Medical insurance fee will be included in the tuition payment
- Leave of absence for the first semester is not allowed
