Admission Requirements

Freshmen

Incoming freshman must hold a high school diploma or higher at the beginning of the first term.

Transfer students

Must have completed at least four semesters at a four-year college or university, or have completed a degree at a two or three year college (AA/AS)

Nationality

Neither the applicant nor either of their parents may hold Korean citizenship.

Documents

Freshmen only

- · Official high school diploma or a document with the expected date of graduation
- · Transcript of the last 3 years of high school

Transfer only

- · Official diploma (or certificate of completion) from previously attended universities
- · Official transcript from previous attended universities



Scholarship

Students with the highest interview scores will be granted full tuition scholarships for the first semester.

Academic Excellence Scholarships

Students who exhibit an exemplary undergraduate record in the previous semester with a GPA ranked in the top 5% of registered students are eligible to receive this scholarship.

The KHU alumni association along with various other external organizations also provide scholarships for KIC students.
