The objective of the College of International Studies, Kyung Hee University (KIC), is to educate and train future international specialists who will play a leading role in this era of globalization. To this end, KIC provides students with the necessary skills and perspectives required to prepare them for principal positions in international organizations, global corporations, the media, NGOs and public sector agencies. CURRICULUM

The curriculum of KIC is conducted entirely in English and is truly interdisciplinary encompassing the core disciplines of international relations, international economics, global business and East Asian studies.

01. Concentration Track

Students may optionally choose to pursue one of four concentration tracks: international relations, international economics, global business and East Asian studies. By pursuing a concentration track, students may graduate with a deeper understanding of a specific discipline in international studies. In order to obtain a concentration, students must acquire more than 18 credits in one of these core disciplines.

02. Combined Bachelor/Master's Degree Program

Students may also choose to pursue a joint bachelormaster's degree from KIC and the Graduate School of Pan-Pacific International Studies at Kyung Hee University (GSP). This program can be finished within five (5) years with roughly seven (7) semesters contributing to the bachelor's degree and three (3) semesters to the master's degree.

03. Honors Program

An Honors Program Certificate will be issued to students who achieve excellent grade and contribute to the honor and reputation of KIC.

Applicable candidates must take more than three honors classes at KIC.

04. Four-by-Four Certificate Program

The Four-by-Four Certificate Program was designed as part of the Creative Korea (CK) Program, established and supported by the Korean Ministry of Education as of 2014, so as to assist KIC in fostering globally talented individuals. Students who enroll in the program and who complete the four (4) core capacity courses the honors category are eligible to receive the Four-by-Four certificate upon graduation.





SCHOLARSHIPS

The KIC scholarships can be divided into the following four main types.

01. Academic Excellence Scholarships

Students who exhibit an exemplary undergraduate record in the previous semester with a GPA ranked in the top 5% of registered students are eligible to receive this scholarship.

02. Need-Based Financial Aid

Students who require financial aid to continue their university studies may be eligible for financial support depending upon their parents' financial capability.

03. Financial Aid for Study Abroad

Students who participate in the various study abroad or exchange programs as well as in KIC-run international workshops or internships, can receive a significant amount of financial aid from the college to alleviate their financial burden.

04. Support for Student Domestic/International Activities

In order to garner greater student participation in various domestic or international activities such as the national Model United Nations (MUN) Competition, open contests, conferences, public or private sector internships or international volunteer work projects, KIC provides financial support for participants.

In addition to those listed above, students also have several other avenues for financial assistance for their college education.

Kyung Hee University provides a variety of very attractive scholarships including the CK-II scholarship for those who have achieved an outstanding score on their entrance examination. In fact, several new KIC students come to the college upon receipt of these scholarships every year. Students can also take advantage of a government-funded financial aid program offered by the Korea Student Aid Foundation.

UNIVERSITY FOR CREATIVE KOREA-II

The University for Creative Korea-II (CK-II) is a government effort to financially and technically support university education nationwide. University departments from across the country compete to be selected for the CK-II program. The Kyung Hee College of International Studies together with the Department of Political Science and International Relations have formed a joint cooperative that was selected for CK-II support under its internationalization category in 2014. As a result, KIC, and the Department of Political Science and International Relations have been designated as the recipients of roughly one billion Korean won (roughly one million US dollars) from the Ministry of Education annually. This CK-II support allows KIC to provide a large number of students with a wide array of quality educational benefits.

STUDY ABROAD

Kyung Hee University is a leader among Korean universities in the various measurements of educational internationalization. By taking advantage of more than 380 active cooperation agreements with universities around the world, KHU sends and hyreceives many students every year to and from those sister universities.

In addition to these university-level exchange and study abroad programs in which KIC students actively participate, KIC has a tradition of providing a wide variety of study abroad opportunities exclusively for KIC students. CK-II has further enabled KIC to widen the number of its study abroad programs and provide more financial support for students.

Short Term Study Abroad Opportunities

KIC allows for many prestigious short term study abroad programs in the following educational institutions.

- Fudan University, China: winter, one week
- Johns Hopkins University, USA: summer, four weeks
- Osaka University, Japan: winter, one week
- Stanford University, USA: summer, two weeks
- WFUNA Advanced Training Program, Switzerland: summer or winter, one week

Long Term Exchange Student and Dual Degree Opportunities

KIC's partnerships with leading educational institutions expand every year. Currently, the following universities are hosting these exchange programs.

- University of California, Berkeley, USA: one semester or one year
- University of California, Davis, USA: one semester
- Maastricht University, Netherlands: one semester or one year
- Osnabrück University, Germany: three or four semesters, dual degree
- Osaka University, Japan: one semester or one year
- Renmin University, China: one semester
- Adolfo Ibanez University, Chile: one semester
- Friedrich-Alexander University, Germany: one semester

STUDY ABROAD

FUDAN UNIVERSITY

At Fudan University, located in Shanghai, China, students participate in an international workshop with a focus on China's politics, economy, society, culture and foreign relations. Students also have the opportunity to experience and become immersed in Chinese culture by exploring the city of Shanghai, the center of China's economy.

JOHNS HOPKINS UNIVERSITY

At the Johns Hopkins University Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS), a preeminent school for graduate study in international affairs, students participate in the Short Course on American Foreign Policy (AFP) for a duration of four weeks. The course is accompanied by lectures and site visits to the World Bank, Pentagon, Capitol Hill and other notable institutions.

OSAKA UNIVERSITY

At the Osaka University School of International Public Policy (OSIPP), founded to facilitate research on issues and policies that transcend national, cultural and other, students participate in workshops that help train them to acquire the cross-disciplinary knowledge and advanced analytical capabilities required to resolve complex social problems.











STANFORD UNIVERSITY

This two-week, intensive lecture series address major and timely issues dealing with the larger theme of innovation and entrepreneurship in Silicon Valley and their implications for Asia. The lectures will be delivered by a range of speakers, including academics, educators and practitioners at Stanford and in the Silicon Valley area. Half of the lectures will provide a broad, academic perspective on innovation and entrepreneurship while the remaining half will focus on the experiences of practitioners who are currently working in (or with) startup businesses. Lectures will take place at Stanford University with field trips to various places in Silicon Valley.



WFUNA ADVANCED TRAINING PROGRAM AT UNITED NATIONS

This one-week training program is held at WFUNA (World Federation of United Nations Associations) in Geneva. Students engages in the work of the United Nations and visit various UN agencies and civil society partners. For example, students observe United Nations Human Rights Council meetings and study home and foreign human rights affairs. This program educates students to become global leaders.





INTERNSHIPS

KIC provides students with an extensive choice of internships, job search programs and student job activities that are backed by the CK-II.

The internships at KIC are also supported financially through the CK-II. Internships allow for students to gain work experience at the international level in the United Nations, various international organizations, NGOs and private firms. KIC also provides a few students with the opportunity to participate in the Washington Center Program which allows students to work in various organizations that play central roles. KIC also hosts frequent jobrelated seminars by professionals from various sectors, mentorship programs between graduates and current students, and makes manuals available targeted to the job search.

The Washington Center Internship

The Washington Center (TWC) Internship provides the selected students with the chance to work at US governmental organizations, international organizations, or corporations in Washington, DC, USA.

These students will take part in the internship, academic courses and leadership forums. KIC provides a significant financial assistance in the form of a scholarship of 7 million Korean won per student to three participants every year. The internship usually runs for about 15 weeks and students receive up to 9 credit units.

UN Internship

To nurture global leaders for the 21st century and promote world peace, the Kyung Hee–UN Internship Program allows students to work as interns at United Nations Offices in New York Headquarters (USA), Geneva (Switzerland), Bangkok (Thailand) and others. Internship credits are approved upon review by the academic adviser of the student.

Airfare and living expenses are fully covered, usually by the university. KIC students are encouraged to take full advantage of this prestigious internship scholarship.



"From February to July 2014, I worked as an administrative intern at the Director's Office within the Division of Budget and Finance of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), which is located in Vienna, Austria.

I have learned a lot from working in an UN organization such as the IAEA. My academic experiences and study abroad opportunities at KIC have greatly contributed to my performance and learning capacities outside of school."

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

KIC is widely known for its diverse extracurricular student activities. Such activities range from those oriented to academic development to networking and sports.

KIC Student Council

The KIC Student Council serves the ultimate goal of assisting students in maximizing their educational adventure while at KIC. The KIC Student Council administrates and coordinates all student affairs including studies, student-faculty/student-administration staff relations and club activities. In order to further these aims, the KIC Student Council promotes and assists students in forming new programs that can enhance the KIC experience for students. In addition, the KIC Student Council has always been instrumental to the maintenance of friendly, family-like relationships between students, the KIC administration office, and professors. KIC has a history of comfortable, free and friendly relations between students, administrators and professors. It completely normal for students to meet together with administrative officers and/or professors for a cup of coffee to share opinions on education and all matters pertaining to KIC in general.

KIC the Globe

KIC the Globe (KTG) is an independent academic student press organization founded in 2008. KIC publishes student academic journals, regular newsletters, and also hosts writing sessions, and sponsors the KIC Academia, a student academic paper contest. The central activity, that of publishing the KIC newsletter three times a semester, is an effort to promote communication and information sharing amongst professors, alumni and current students. Writing sessions are held regularly every week in order to enhance the writing skills of members. For KIC Academia, seminars on academic paper writing are regularly held by professors. Students freely write and present their papers during the contest. The ultimate goal of KTG is to academically inspire students.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

KIMUN Secretariat

The KIMUN secretariat is an independent, non-profit Model United Nations (MUN) student organization founded in 2008. It is the central organization responsible for hosting Korea's most prominent MUNs and MUN-related workshops. Although formally established in 2008, KIC has had a tradition of involvement in hosting and participating in MUNs since 1994. Since 2008, the KIMUN secretariat has organized more than 24 conferences, programs and camps.

The KIMUN Secretariat's central conferences include the Kyung Hee International Model United Nations (KIMUN), the KIMUN Workshop for mid-dle and high school students, the World Federation of the United Nations Association (WFUNA) Youth Camp hosted by the UN Association (UNA), the G20 KHU Summit which began as a commemoration of the G20 Seoul Summit in 2010, and last but not least, Global Classrooms: Seoul (GC Seoul). GC Seoul is one of the largest middle school/high school MUNs occurring annually with hundreds of participants. GC is conducted worldwide in 24 of the world's major cities in partnership with the United Nations Association of the United States of America (UNA-USA) and Kyung Hee University. The KIMUN Secretariat is considered the founding secretariat of MUNs in Korea and has since established the foundation for MUN secretariats nationwide. The KIMUN Secretariat believes that MUNs are the perfect opportunity for in-depth education regarding the United Nations. Volunteer KIC

Volunteer KIC (VOLKIC) is an independent student organization where member students plan and conduct various volunteer activities for the purpose of social responsibility both domestically and internationally. Since its establishment in 2011 at KIC, VOLKIC hosts various volunteer activities such as World Citizen Education which provides individual mentoring programs, and the Happy Wall Project which involves the improvement of environments nationwide through the painting of rather dreary walls. In addition, VOLKIC has been participating in global volunteer activities in Laos in collaboration with the National University of Laos.



STUDENT LIFE AND HOUSING

KIC is a tightly-knit community of KIC students, administrative officers and professors that actively interact with one another. Because most students live in the school dorm or in proximity to the school, participation is easily facilitated in a number of clubs, student organizations and annual events hosted by Student Council such as the International Night. The students have consequently developed a very strong sense of community that is greater than most other schools or departments.

The average student at KIC is surrounded by close friends throughout the normal school day. Our professors participate in school club activities (such as sports) alongside students, further contributing to our strong sense of community. The networks created during college life last a lifetime for most students, professors and administrative officers.

Students can access housing opportunities in the official school dormitories or rent nearby rooms off campus. Both options have their merits. School dormitories provide dining and a large number of essential services, all within the dormitory. However, off campus housing is also a viable option, and pricing is usually quite affordable.


